Proposed No Cold calling zone - Baycliff

Local residents and PCSO Helen Madden delivered voting slips and chatted to locals about the proposed scheme and its importance for helping to keep their community safe on 17 March.

We are working with the local parish council, Trading Standards and the local community to implement scheme.







Additional Police desks within retail premises

On 16 March, PCSO Helen Madden and PCSO Janine Wade set up additional police desks in Booths in Ulverston to provide support and information for staff and customers during retail crime action month.

Cold Calling

Support and advice was provided to the family of an elderly resident who reported cold calling on 4 March in Swarthmoor & Low Furness.

The workmen started to carry out additional work not agreed.

Details of the offenders have been shared with Trading Standards and the local Parish Council made aware.
